Season Formats – subject to change if court space or teams numbers change

- A Grade – 15 weeks Round Robin QF SF and Final on 10th Oct
- A Res 1 – 7 week round robin, Grading Game, 7 week round robin and Final – TBC – Bye teams will play each other in a game that will not count toward season competition points.
- A Res 2 – 7 week round robin, Grading Game, 7 week round robin and Final – TBC – Bye teams will play each other in a game that will not count toward season competition points.
- B Grade – 9 weeks round robin then Split Round Robin for 3 weeks and Semis and Finals for the Top 4 while the bottom 5 play 5 weeks of Split Round Robin

A couple of situations to go over:

- Defender is in illegal guarding position, contact occurs, offensive player is not disadvantaged or in the act of shooting = NO FOUL
- Defender is in illegal guarding position, contact occurs, offensive player is disadvantaged or in the act of shooting = FOUL

Art. 37 Unsportsmanlike Foul

An unsportsmanlike foul is a player contact foul which, in the judgement of an official is:

- Not a legitimate attempt to directly play the ball within the spirit and intent of the rules.
- Excessive, hard contact caused by a player in an effort to play the ball or an opponent.
- An unnecessary contact caused by the defensive player in order to stop the progress of the offensive team in transition. This applies until the offensive player begins his act of shooting.
- Contact by the defensive player from behind or laterally on an opponent in an attempt to stop the fast break and there is no defensive player between the offensive player and the opponent's basket. This applies until the offensive player begins his act of shooting.
- Contact by the defensive player on an opponent on the playing court when the game clock shows 2:00 minutes or less in the fourth quarter and in each overtime, when the ball is out-of-bounds for a throw-in and still in the hands of the official or at the disposal of the player taking the throw-in.
